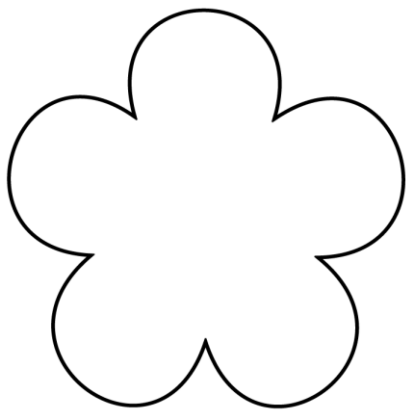


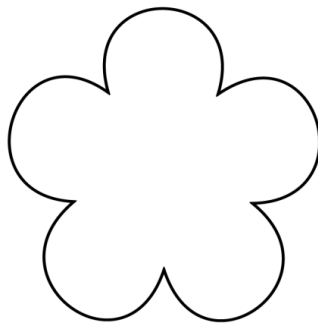
Felt Flower Tutorial



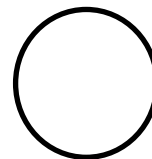
Make this little felt flower to place on your dolls/toys hair. This is the perfect size to place on the hair of my 'Don't Worry Doll' (pictured above). You can find the pattern for the 'Don't Worry Doll' in my [Etsy](#) or [Craftsy](#) stores. You could also make this flower to embellish a notebook cover, bag, headband, or to attach to a keyring or hairclip.



Flower A



Flower B



Flower Centre

Trace the templates onto paper and cut them out. Then pin these onto felt in the colour of your choice and carefully cut out the shapes.

You will need:

2 x Flower A

1 x Flower B

1 x Flower Centre

Place the two Flower A felt shapes together and blanket stitch them together using 2 strands of matching embroidery thread colour. This will then form a firm base for the flower (refer Photo A).

Blanket stitch your Flower B shape (using 2 strands of matching embroidery thread colour) onto your completed Flower A piece (Refer to Photo B).

Now take your Flower Centre felt shape and using 2 strands of matching embroidery thread colour, blanket stitch it onto the centre of the Flower B (Refer to Photo c).

You've finished! Place the flower onto your dolls or toys hair or use it to decorate something and enjoy!

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
